Trust Plan.

Goal: Based ELA SAGE scores, current iReady and DIBELS scores, and scores from our continuum assessment scores we have determined that Reading is our greatest area of need. We have set the following goal based on that data. By the end of May 2018 75% of students grades K-6 will meet proficiency levels of the Reading Promises Continuum. (See Attached file for the Reading Promises Continuum) Note: We chose to concentrate on just this one goal. The Reading Promises Continuum addresses four different areas of reading -- Phonemic Awareness, Phonics, Fluency and Comprehension. This goal is intensive and inclusive of four major foundational reading skills. Therefore the one goal wraps four comprehensive goals together. We also have a behavioral component to this goal. Please see details in the description section of the Behavior Component of the goal.

## Funds paid for:

- 1. Teacher Collaboration Time Instructional Assistant to provide teachers common time to do in depth data analysis, instructional grouping and planning with related services on student performance as related to the Reading Promises Continuum.
- 2. Intervention Para professionals to administer tier 2 and tier 3 instruction on Reading Promises skills
- 3. Behavior Interventionist partial salary
