Suggestions to increase communication:

- Input from SCC- What can we do to increase school communication to parents? Parents say they don't get the ParentLinks that are sent out. The school needs a cell phone and an email address. Possibly Jill and Debi can meet with Parent Link this summer.
- SCC likes getting the text. How can we add that the text comes from Spring Creek.
- School should send as much info as possible (email, text, home notes). Possible solution is to send a weekly email Sunday night to parents with the week's events, send Sunday evening around 6:00 PM. If a paper is sent home it is good if the kids are rewarded if they bring it back signed. Sometimes when the message is sent twice then parents respond.
- Parents don't find out quick enough that their child isn't doing well. They find out at the end of the term or at PTCs, it would be better to find out sooner. Possibly send home a midterm report for struggling students. Possible have teacher can reach out to those struggling, then ask the parent to contact the teacher if they would like a meeting.
- Parent need access to resources to help students with math. Parent training on how to access math books online. IXL is a great resource.

Review of DIBELS UGG data:

Our Kindergarten was at 95% which is the highest in the district. Across the school we are meeting the state goal of 47%. We are above 60% across all grades. We want to wait for EOY data to determine what our goal for next year is, debating between 70%-75% growth score.
