Agenda Items:

- Safe UT APP Presentation -- Logan Telford went through the presentation that will be done for students and teachers in 5th and 6th grade
 - Presented again after PTA Meeting, advertised to parents in Feb. Newsletter, and available at PTCs
 - Notes from presentation: Making schools a safe and kind place. This presentation will be shared with 5th and 6th grade students. Safe Utah App that is an additional line of help for our students and community. This app can give students the ability to report anonymously and feel safe doing so. SafeUT Crisis line- use for emergency. SafeUT Send a tip- something that is not urgent and can wait until the next day. You can report in a chat or a phone call. Available on App Store and Google Play. Eventually there will be a link on our school website. This should be live by the end of February-beginning of March. Logan our School Social Worker will be available during PTCs to help parents download the app and understand the importance.
 - Parents want to make sure that tips are investigated to make sure the tip is accurate. Jill explained the process she takes when a report of bullying is given to her. After investigation there will be a report filed if it is determined that there was bullying involved. Parents will be given the opportunity to include/exclude their children from this presentation.

 - School Accountability Report
 - Notes: We reviewed SAGE results and we show typical in achievement (near State average) and we showed exemplary in growth! This is amazing for the population that we work with.
 - DIBELS MOY Report

- Notes: We reviewed DIBELS MOY growth scores by grade level to recognize strengths and weaknesses. Discussed the data meetings that we hold to put students into groups for intervention and enrichment.
- Our greatest area of need continues to be Language Arts. There was a vote by the School Community Council and all were in favor to say that our goal will be a Language Arts. DIBELS is a nice way to measure this.
- We received \$6159 increase in our SCC budget. Jill will write an amendment to our plan to use it to replace aging technology. There was a vote and all were in favor.
