- Ashley moved to vote on the goals as worded below. Cristina seconded it. All voted in favor of having the following goals. (Ashley, Jackie, YiSong, Cristina, Katie, Jill)
- Progress: Increase the percentage of students reaching typical, above typical or well above typical progress by 7% based on DIBELS MOY to EOY.
- Proficiency: Increase the percentage of the students reaching benchmark, above benchmark or well above benchmark from DIBELS BOY to EOY by 9%.
 - Expenditures -- See Website

Katie moved to vote on the funding to keep Collaboration Instructional Assistants (Art and Keyboarding) as well as the maximum expenditure for behavior support. Additional Funds: partial teacher salary, aging technology. Ashley seconded it. All voted in favor in of this funding plan (Ashley, Jackie, YiSong, Cristina, Katie, Jill)

Notes for reference from previous meetings

- Goals for 2019-20
 - We agree that we should have a goal that can be measured using DIBELS because it is common for all grade levels.
 - We could have two goals. One focused on proficiency -- increase the number of students reaching benchmark or better. One on progress -- increase the number of students making typical or better progress.
 - SCC would like input from teachers about the goal what % increase is realistic.
 - Next meeting we will look at proficiency data and teacher input to finalize goals and expenditures.
- Greatest Need Discussion
 - School Accountability Report
 - Notes: We reviewed SAGE results and we show typical in achievement (near State average) and we showed exemplary in growth! This is amazing for the population that we work with.
 - DIBELS MOY Report
 - Notes: We reviewed DIBELS MOY growth scores by grade level to recognize strengths and weaknesses. Discussed the data meetings that we hold to put students into groups for intervention and enrichment.
- Our greatest area of need continues to be Language Arts. There was a vote by the School Community Council and all were in favor to say that our goal will be a Language Arts. DIBELS is a nice way to measure this.
 - We received \$6159 increase in our SCC budget. Jill will write an amendment to our plan to use it to replace aging technology. There was a vote and all were in favor.
