Motion to approve the expenditures for collaboration and Tier 2 and Tier 3 Instructional Assistants- Tyler Steele moved to vote in favor, Jackie McDermott was the second. The voting was unanimous.

Move to approve \$7000 to fund student success coach- Jill made a motion, Tyler Steele was the second. The voting was unanimous.

Agreed on the expenditures of additional funds for 2020- 21

Increased funds will be used to support Goal 1 and 2 by funding one or more of the following needs: a partial teacher salary to keep class sizes reasonable, replacement of aging technology, fund additional instructional assistants for tiered instruction or other related software and technology supplies or other intervention supplies.

Rationale: We have tier 2 and tier 3 interventions that include technology practice. Without adequate updates to our technology equipment and programs we are unable to use these resources effectively. We also use consumable resources that need to be replaced every year. We serve an at-risk population with many challenges. Keeping

class sizes manageable helps teachers build crucial relationships, provide adequate instruction, implement the behavior supports and academic interventions that we have in place. Adequate support staff is crucial to executing our School Impr

Mrs. Franklin explained that there might be additional funds available at the end of this year. She asked if the committee agreed it should go towards technology, for something like the annual Mystery Science subscription. No vote was needed because it is already in the 19-20 plan but members agreed that this would be a good way to spend the money.
