Raptor program: a visitor management program

- Made possible by a Cops Grant
- Video of the Raptor program
- Spring Creek has a station just inside front doors.
- The station can scan a driver's license, but visitors can also show any government issued document and have it entered manually. Once ID is scanned, secretary will unlock door. Visitors mustn't hold door open, so all need to be scanned in. Visitor is given a printed badge to wear in building. When leaving, give badge to secretary, and secretary tells system the visitor is leaving.
  - Park City was first in the state to start using Raptor. This type of visitor management is commonplace in other states.
  - What happens if visitors don't have a driver's license? If they do not have an ID, school can make arrangements to have them in the building, an escorted visit. Then they are encouraged to get some type of id.
  - Even parents who are well known (e.g., PTA), will need to follow this procedure for entering the school.
  - Inner doors have a bullet resistant glazing on it.
  - Raptor also helps us always know who is in our building.
  - PR campaign, then sent out to each school, schools will post it and communicate to parents.
  - Information obtained through Raptor will only be used for the school and not sent out to anyone else.
  - Jill-concerned that some parents will be frustrated with this.

**VIII. Principal Update** Jill Franklin (Administrative VP)

➤ Maturation program has changed. It will only happen in 5th grade. We will prepare to send out information to parents. It is different than what we have traditionally done. We will reach out to PTA on what you think we should keep. This is a change from what PTA usually does. Happening April 2.

➤ A face to face after school program - March 22, only academic, by referral only. District curriculum specialist coming to train the after-school staff.

➤ We are also working on a summer school program.

➤ We are considering not sending our chrome books home during spring break. We need them functioning for end of level testing. **Suggestion by Tyler Steele: opt in to keep Chrome book if they think they need it.**

➤ The after school program, called Academic Success, mentioned by Jill. If a child has been referred, they will receive email and a form. Once we see who will fit in the first round, then they will see who else can be added. It will be based on academic scores.

**X. School Board Update** Jennifer Partridge (School Board member)

- Stipend of money from the state, will be paid on the 19th, given to teachers, some paraeducators, prorated to part-time employees.
  - District will use extra money (CAREs) to give to staff (1% of their pay).
  - Camp Big Springs - No Big Springs this year. Health department is really concerned with safety. District will put all our resources into summer school. Everyone has been impacted academically. Summer school is one step to helping students catch up. Yes, there will be busing available for summer school.
    - This year the district will hold ourselves harmless -- it's ok if class sizes are a little small. We want to hire more paraeducators to help in classrooms to give targeted help.
    - Phase 3 (return to normal school schedule) - would give the teacher's less prep time, but not taking anything off teacher's plate. It's decided that it would be too burdensome. Extra time in the day needed to clean, extra space at lunch. Phase 3 just not going to work yet.
      - Will school be normal next year? I'm assuming that it will be. Hopefully won't need masks, either.
