Federal Legislation \$\$\$



Title I, Part A, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, provides financial assistance to local education agencies and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.

Free/Reduced Lunch

Title I schools receive funds to supplement existing programs. It is determined by poverty level. In Utah, we use free and reduced lunch to determine poverty level.

Funds require accountability and a school plan



Academic Needs

Funds must be used to address academic needs; schools are required to address needs



Supplement

Funds supplement the school's current programs



Parent Engagement

School plans must include opportunities for parents to engage in the academic success of their children


Language support is provided in multiple ways:


Working together!
