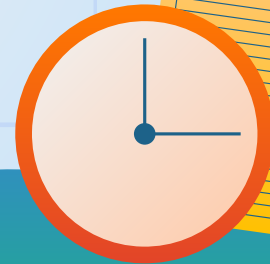


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What is Title I?

Federal Legislation \$\$\$

Title I, Part A, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, provides financial assistance to local education agencies and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.



Free/Reduced Lunch

Title I schools receive funds to supplement existing programs based off of poverty status. In Utah, we use free and reduced lunch to determine this status.

Funding has nothing to do with academic performance - it has everything to do with free/reduced lunch! Please be sure to fill out a free/reduced lunch application each year!

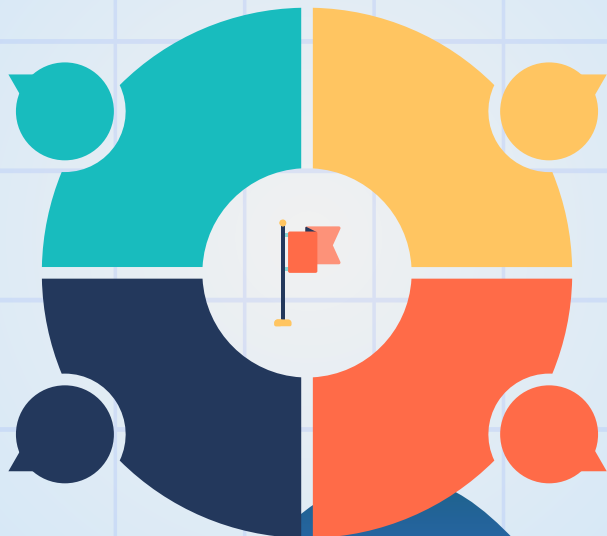
