Title I Schools receive funds to supplement existing programs based off of income status. In Utah, we use free and reduced lunch to determine poverty status and funding for schools with high needs.

Funding has nothing to do with academic performance.

Federal Funds Require Accountability

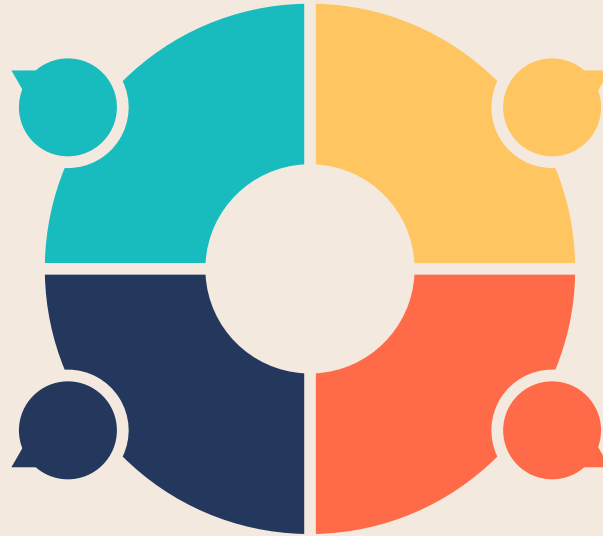
