1. **Review Trustlands Goals for 2024-25 school year**
 - a. **Goal:** Increase the number of students meeting proficiency on ELA RISE state assessments by 3% from 2023-24 school year.
 - i. This comes from the critical need to strengthen literacy recognized in the teacher and student survey
 - ii. RISE proficiency is the overarching goal - Acadience benchmark skills build a foundation for RISE.
2. **Budget/Expenditures**
 - a. Student Success Coach (40 hours/week): \$40,000
 - i. Our students have many SEL needs. This helps support those needs.
 - ii. Pre-teaching Second Step lessons (also provides time for teachers to pull students one on one to progress monitor)
 - iii. Pushing in to classes to support students
 - iv. One on one social skills lessons
 - v. Restorative conferences between students

- b. Specialty teacher(s) (29 hours/week) \$29,000
 - i. Provides common collaboration time for teachers throughout the week.
 - c. Remaining funds will be used toward funding additional paraprofessionals
 - i. Support teachers in providing interventions/extensions to meet student needs.
- 3. Vote on new Trustlands Plan**
- a. Vote on approval of plan - Ashley Rayback moves to approve plan and Jenny Wright seconded. Approval passed unanimously.
- 4. Review rules of order and procedures: -we will do this next month.**

Review Needs Assessment and 2024-25 proposed School Improvement Plan

- 1. Went over our Proficiency and Growth data
- 2. Explained what the sub-categories are and what the state looks at when evaluating schools
- 3. Parents brought up the concern of adequate support for our ML students. We discussed the different supports we have at Spring Creek. Tier 1 strategies, Newcomer pull out small groups, new AI devices/apps. The number of ML students/Newcomers we have presents a huge challenge for teachers and students.
- 4. School Climate Survey - Areas for celebration and improvement
 - a. Focus for next year - Building self-efficacy in our students - the belief in themselves that they can academically improve. This is a huge indicator of future success.
